

PEGGY VAUGHN OMER

Peggy Vaughan Omer, a resident of Amesbury, MA, studied oils, acrylic, and water-based mediums at the New School of Art in Toronto, Canada; The School of the Boston Museum of Fine Arts; and Antioch College in Yellow Springs, Ohio. She lived and painted on California's Monterey Peninsula from 1982-2002. In California, Omer exhibited at the Evans Gallery in Carmel; Henry Miller Library in Big Sur; and other juried shows in Seaside, Monterey and Pacific Grove where she won numerous awards for her work.

In 2005, 2006 and 2008 she had shows in the Laura Coombs Hills Gallery at the Newburyport Art Association (NAA), where she is a long-standing member. In 2012 she had a show at the MA Audubon Society in Joppa Flats and she exhibits regularly at Art on Bartlett Mall during Yankee Homecoming in July. Omer has paintings in private collections across the U.S. and abroad and recently painted a public art mural for Salisbury, MA.

Omer's paintings are inspired by the Massachusetts North Shore's natural beauty. Her work also encompasses watercolors inspired by the Pacific coastline and Big Sur redwoods, and flora and wildlife of both the East and West coasts.
